Srinagar and Pahalgam begin to bloom.

Gulmarg: India's Skiing Capital

Gulmarg is the crown jewel of winter tourism in Kashmir. Located around 50 km from Srinagar, this meadow of flowers turns into a snow-covered expanse in winter, attracting skiers from around the world. The highlight is the **Gulmarg Gondola**, one of the highest cable cars in the world, which takes you up to **Apharwat Peak** where snow is guaranteed even in late March.

Once you're up there, the scenery is surreal: endless stretches of snow, crystal-clear skies, and perfect conditions for skiing, snowboarding, and even heli-skiing. You'll also find snowmobile rides, snowboarding rentals, and private skiing lessons, making it beginner-friendly. Don't forget to explore the frozen Alpathar Lake (weather permitting).

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Pahalgam: A Peaceful Snow Retreat

Unlike Gulmarg's action-packed slopes, **Pahalgam** is quieter, more romantic, and ideal for those who want to enjoy the snow in a slower, more intimate setting. Snow blankets the pine forests and riverbanks here, especially in **Betaab Valley** and **Aru Valley**. You can take long snow walks, sip kahwa in a cozy cottage, and even take a pony ride through the icy trails.

Though not a skiing destination, Pahalgam's charm lies in its peaceful vibe, stunning snow-covered vistas, and its proximity to Lidder River, which partly freezes and makes for excellent winter photography.

Best time to visit for snow: December to February

Recommended stay: 2 nights

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Srinagar: Culture Meets Snow

The capital city **Srinagar** becomes a dreamy destination in winter. **Dal Lake**, known for its shikaras

and houseboats, partially freezes, creating a truly unique experience. A ride on a snow-dusted shikara is something you won't forget. The city's **Mughal gardens**, **Hazratbal Shrine**, and **markets** like Lal Chowk wear a coat of white, adding to the city's timeless charm.

You can also stay in a traditional wooden houseboat with heating and hot meals, which is perfect for honeymooners. Don't forget to enjoy local winter cuisine like **harissa** and **noon chai** while warming up indoors.

Sonmarg: Snow Adventures for the Brave

Located at a higher altitude, **Sonmarg** often closes in peak winter due to heavy snow, but reopens in **early March**, making it one of the best late-season snow destinations in Kashmir. If you're lucky to visit while it's open, you'll witness some of the most untouched snowy terrains in India.

The **Thajiwas Glacier** trek (if open) is a thrilling experience, offering deep snow even when Srinagar starts warming up. Sonmarg is ideal for those who like off-the-beaten-path adventures and can handle colder, more unpredictable conditions.

Must-Do Winter Activities in Kashmir

The Gondola in Gulmarg is an experience in itself. It takes you from 8,000 ft to over 13,000 ft, offering views of snow-covered Himalayan peaks. The upper phase often sees temperatures dipping below - 10°C, so gear up accordingly.

Frozen Lake Visits

Dal Lake in Srinagar and small alpine lakes in Gulmarg partially freeze over, creating mesmerizing visuals and unique travel moments. Local shikara rides during winter are peaceful and surreal.

Sledding & Snowball Fights

Simple joys like sledding or building a snowman in the meadows of Pahalgam or Sonmarg are perfect for families with kids or couples seeking lighthearted fun.

Snow Photography

Kashmir's winter landscapes offer unmatched photo opportunities. Carry extra batteries (they drain faster in cold) and wide lenses to capture the grandeur of the region.
