Often referred to as the 'Ajanta of the Himalayas,' this monastery, a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is over a thousand years old and houses a stunning collection of murals and thangka paintings.

Day 5: Tabo to Kaza via Dhankar and Pin Valley

After exploring the ancient relics of Tabo, you'll head towards Dhankar, the former capital of the Spiti Kingdom. The Dhankar Monastery, perched precariously on a cliff overlooking the confluence of the Pin and Spiti rivers, offers one of the most iconic views in the valley. You can also opt for a short trek to the stunning Dhankar Lake.

Next, you'll venture into the breathtaking Pin Valley, a national park known for its unique flora and fauna, including the elusive snow leopard. The vibrant green meadows of Mudh village, the last motorable village in the valley, make for a perfect photo opportunity. By evening, you'll reach Kaza, the sub-divisional headquarters of Spiti and the main hub of your tour.
